Dan Beard Council Honors Principal Fulmer as Part of a Great Day for St. James Scouts



Today in America, about 1 in 4 boys will become a Scout, but it is interesting to know that of the leaders in this nation in business, religion and politics, 3 out of 4 were Scouts.

On May 22, Dan Beard Council - Boy Scouts of America held its West Side breakfast, an annual celebration of scouting at which St. James, its school principal and its scouts took the opportunity to shine. St. James Principal Jeff Fulmer – a prime example of leadership through scouting -- received council's William Henry Harrison Award, earned by his life-long dedication to scouting programs. He started as a Cub Scout at St. Martin of Tours before joining Troop 238 at Our Lady of Visitation where he earned the rank of Eagle Scout in 1997. He had many great experiences including backpacking at the Philmont ranch in New Mexico and canoeing in the Boundary Waters in Northern Minnesota. He was also involved in a variety of youth training programs, including becoming the Director at Camp Friedlander in 2002, all of which inspired him to become a leader in youth education.

It is fitting – given Mr. Fulmer's successful service at St. James -- that a number of his current and former students appeared with him in scout leadership roles at the May 22 event. Aaron Porotsky, St. James Alumnus and Star Scout with St. James Troop 24, opened the morning with an invocation, thanking God for those who serve youth and asking the Lord's blessing on those who work to inspire youth to lives of service and integrity. Zachary Nienaber, St. James Alumnus and Eagle Scout of Troop 24, spoke to the crowd by recounting his Eagle project in which he organized scouts, parents, and neighbors to collect school supplies for the benefit of the local St. Joseph's orphanage. He highlighted the touching note he received from a donor, thanking him, since this donor's husband had once been a resident at St. Josephs himself! Finally, six more scouts from Troop 24 honored America by presenting the colors for the Pledge of Allegiance in a flag ceremony led by Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Justin Nienaber, St. James Alumnus and

Life Scout. The flag bearers included Bryan Barry (Eagle Scout and St. James Alumnus), and four first-year boy scouts in 6th grade: John Harlow, Nicholas Kramer, Billy Porotsky, and Nick Munro.

All of those involved in St. James Pack 24 and Troop 24 appreciate Principal Fulmer's great example of leadership and service, as well as his continued support of scouts in our parish. Congratulations and thank you Mr. Fulmer.
